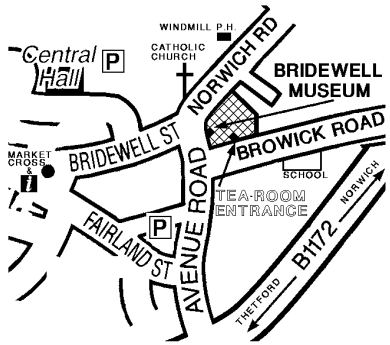


HOW TO FIND US

What to see and do

Tour the historic Bridewell and discover great stories about Wymondham's history.

Wymondham Bridewell



A 'model prison' (1785) based on the ideas of the great prison reformer **John Howard**. Below ground see the re-created **dungeon** and the eight **steps** (*below left*) Howard went down to inspect the dungeon (1779), which can be seen outside.



Handle the **ankle chains** from the original dungeon. The **prison door** (*above right*) leads to a display about the model prison.

In addition the Bridewell served as a **police station** and **courthouse**.

Visit the **police cell**.

Journey through Wymondham's colourful history and learn about its people.

Travel through Prehistoric times, the Iron Age, the Romans and Saxons to medieval Wymondham's beautiful **Abbey**.

Follow the story of **Robert Kett**, leader of Tudor England's most inspiring rebellion.



Find out about Wymondham's **Great Fire** of 1615 and how a new **Market Cross** was built.



Discover Victorian life and work - photos, children's toys, brewing and railways.

Learn about Farming and shopping before mechanisation and supermarkets and **enjoy** the unique **brushmaking** display (below) which includes a working machine.
